RUAE - How to Answer Each Type of Question

In Your Own Words

Don't quote from the passage. Bullet point if possible.

Imagery

Quote the image Say what is being compared to what Comment on the comparison's effectiveness

"Just as....so it is in the passage that...This is effective because..."

Tone

Identify the tone
Quote the words or phrase which helped you
work this out
Comment on HOW it helped you work out the

Referring to the Passage/Writer's Attitude

Identify the writer's attitude/opinion Quote the words or phrase which helped you work this out

Comment on HOW it helped you work out the attitude

Summarise Key Points from Passage

Bullet point if possible.

Scan passage for the main ideas covered or points made about the topic. Put these in your own words.

TIP Try scanning the topic sentences as these will be where the writer introduces new points.

Word Choice

Quote the word
State the connotations (what does the word make you think of?)
Explain it's effect in reference to what the question is asking

Sentence Structure

Identify the feature of sentence structure used
Comment on it's effect

Linking

Quote the part of the sentence which links back.

Say what it inks back to.

Quote the part that links forward.

Say what idea it links forward to.

Effective Opening/Closing Paragraph

Pick an aspect of the paragraph Comment on why it's effective in opening or concluding the passage.

TIP For opening, think about ways in which the writer catches your attention. For conclusion, think about how they summarise or tie up what they've been talking about in the passage.

Remember to check how many marks each question is worth. This will tell you how much you need to write.

Try to bullet point your answers where possible.
